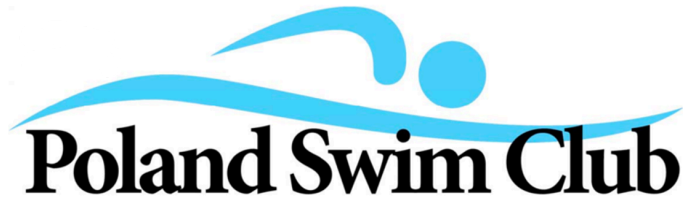

- All parties are from 8:00pm-11:00pm unless otherwise arranged with the pool manager.
- We will only book 2 private parties per month.
- Set up can begin at 7:30pm.
- Party clean-up should begin 15 minutes before completion of the party. The dumpster is available in the back of the swim club if needed.
- Contact person is responsible for overall management of the party as well as behavior of guests.
- If the pool closes due to inclement weather conditions, you will be notified and the party can be rescheduled. Inclement weather is temperatures below 70 degrees and/or thunder or lightning. Please have an alternate date or a plan prepared in advance.
- All regular operations pool rules are effective during private parties. See attached Pool and Facility Rules handout.
- J&T Concessions will not be in operation during private parties. You may arrange your own catering/food service for the event. They will provide catering for your event. If you are interested, please contact Jaime Cochran (330) 565-0085.
- Alcohol may be brought into the club for attendees over 21 to consume. No selling of alcohol to attendees may occur. NO GLASS CONTAINERS of any kind.

POOL AND FACILITY RULES

Swimming Pool:

- No running on the pool deck
- No horseplay in the pool
- Only splash balls are permitted in the pool
- No jumping or diving from the diving blocks
- Swimmers who are able to swim in the main pool are not permitted to swim in the toddler pool
- Pool floats are permitted only during float nights (Sunday 5:00 to 9:00pm) or on special occasions as announced
- Pool floats for infant and toddlers are permitted at all times
- Noodles are permitted at all times
- Swimmers must abide by any instructions given by lifeguards or managers regarding behavior in the pool

Diving Boards:

- One person on the diving board at a time
- Pool must be clear before diving
- Swimmers must exit to the ladder closest to the diving board
- Swimmers must perform forward-facing dives
- Swimmers may only bounce once on the board before jumping or diving
- No swimmers wearing floaties may go off the diving board
- No other swimmer may wait in the deep end for another swimmer to use the diving board

Facility Rules:

- Place trash in the trash receptacles
- Rocks, gaga pit rocks, bocce court rocks, etc. must remain in the designated areas, landscaping beds, etc.
- Members must pay for guests at the front desk upon entering the club
- Guests are limited to 6 visits per summer, excluding attendance to parties
- Members must observe posted rules for specific areas of the club (i.e. basketball court, tennis courts, etc.)
- Members and guests must abide by any instructions given by pool employees when using club facility

DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

Managers and lifeguards have the authority to discipline and correct any behavior that violates the Club's rules and regulations and/or may cause harm to members, guests or club property.

For swimmers who are under 18, disciplinary actions may include but are not limited to the following consequences (listed in increasing order of severity):

1. Warning
2. Time out and phone call to parent
3. Loss of pool privileges pending a meeting with the parent.

Infractions that are severe in nature may result in immediate loss of pool privileges pending a meeting with the pool employee(s), board members, parent(s) and child in question.

Guests may be expelled for severe violations of pool rules and regulations and may be prohibited from future use of the Club.

BULLYING

The Poland Swim Club Board considers incidents of bullying and harassment committed against any member or guest to be offenses that will be addressed in a serious manner.

Bullying shall be defined as unwanted, aggressive behavior that is repeated or has the potential to be repeated over time. Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group or activity on purpose.

Types of bullying may include but are not limited to the acts described below:

Verbal bullying: teasing, name-calling, inappropriate sexual comments, taunting and threatening to cause harm.

Social bullying: leaving someone out on purpose, telling others not to be friends with someone, spreading rumors about someone and embarrassing someone in public.

Physical bullying: initiating unwanted physical contact, spitting, tripping, pushing, taking and/or breaking someone's things and making mean or rude hand gestures.
